2 Points: For holding a charity event or volunteering with a charitable organization where 5 or more members attend.


2 Points: Holding a CLE event with a minimum of 4 hours of CLE.



THAT AIN'T NOT RIGHT

Know Their Origin

English has some bizarre colloquialisms (idioms, popular expressions) – which seemingly make little sense to anybody – yet many of which you likely use yourself. Here are the original derivations of just three of them:

<u>Can't do something to save my life</u> – A roundabout way of saying you're completely inept at something. Typically used in self-deprecation.

Example: I'm the last person you want on your team, I can't (run/throw/catch/etc.) to save my life.

Origin: Antony Trollope first used this expression in his book *Kellys and O'Kellys* in 1848.

Turn a blind eye – To pretend not to have noticed something.

Example – You made an odd decision, and I chose to turn a blind eye.

Origin: Attributed to English naval hero Admiral Horatio Nelson who, during a battle, deliberately raised his telescope to his *blind eye*, thereby assuring his inability to see any signal from his superiors to withdraw from the battle.

<u>Head in the clouds</u> – Describes someone being unrealistic, not grounded in reality. Example – If you think you're getting this job, you've got your head in the clouds! Origin: In use since the mid 1600's referencing a fantasist – since having one's head in the clouds is clearly impossible.


