

#### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

There are a couple of things that I've found in this new world that give me great pleasure. One is Google, the other is Alexa. It's wonderful to explore what each one can do for you.

An example of the assistance provided by Google is public speaking. By simply accessing Google and keying in a topic, you generally have a plethora of information—unlike times past when a public speaking event required a trip to either the library or a bookstore.

I've done some public speaking at different times, in different settings, and I find the more you speak, the more you learn. As a 7<sup>th</sup> grader I took a speech class. After all of these years, I am not clear about "everything" I learned, but I do remember that at the end of the year, we had to speak before the class. It was not an option. I stood up in front of the class, gave my presentation, and passed the course. Was that my start in public speaking?

Many of you have done some public speaking (you may not realize you did) and you likely know many TALP members who are quite accomplished at public speaking.

How do they get there? Some tips to consider on your journey to becoming a public speaker.

Know your audience and know your topic. Speaking to our members is tricky as you have to assume they know as much as you. However, if you are speaking to members, bring something to the table they may not know. And then know that topic.

<u>Admit your nervousness</u>. It's okay to tell your audience you are nervous ONCE; but don't repeat. Remember it can, and probably has, happened to everyone.

<u>Don't read your speech!</u> Once you have written it, practice giving it and when the time comes to actually give your presentation, breathe and take a pause at the end of the comment. Reading at times causes problems, such as reading punctuation! Yes, I've heard that done. Use notes to keep you on topic.

Be aware of hand gestures. Hand gestures can be useful to your topic, but learn when and how to use gestures.

<u>Incorporate personal experiences</u>, if appropriate, or visual prompts. Most of your audience can relate to personal experiences, but remember to keep those experiences on topic. If you use visual prompts, be careful about reading them to your audience.

<u>Practice</u>, <u>practice</u>, <u>and practice some more</u>. Don't stop with one presentation. Find your voice. Public speaking builds confidence and allows you to develop patience, and with confidence and patience, you can become a public speaker.

#### The Ethics of Using Non-Attorney Staff to Work Attorney Booth

The Professional Ethics Committee of the State Bar of Texas Ethics Opinion 689

The following question was presented to the committee:

Under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, may a lawyer use a nonlawyer employee to attract prospective clients to a booth in a public place operated by that nonlawyer employee? (Professional Ethics Opinion 689 September 2020).

Following a severe weather event, a law firm set up a booth in a public venue. The booth signage advertised the firm's services in representing property owners' claims against insurance companies regarding damage disputes. The booth was staffed by non-attorney employees of the firm. These employees did not speak to anyone unless they approached the booth. The non-attorney staff would then offer brochures regarding the firm and its services and suggest the booth visitor contact the firm for more information.

The opinion discussed the requirement for attorneys to supervise their non-attorney staff as well as Rule 7.03(a) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct. This rule prohibits an attorney, or someone acting on the attorney's behalf, from in-person solicitation regarding "a matter arising out of a particular occurrence or event, or series of occurrences or events, from a prospective client or nonclient who has not sought the lawyer's advice regarding employment or with whom the lawyer has no family or past or present attorney-client relationship when a significant motive for the lawyer's doing so is the lawyer's pecuniary gain." This rule is the reason paralegals should refrain from recommending or referring someone to a particular attorney, regardless of whether the paralegal works for that specific attorney, unless explicitly asked for this information.

The opinion also discussed Rule 7.06(a), which prohibits a non-attorney employee from being offered or paid any additional compensation or bonus for recruiting new clients. Prohibited compensation would include inducements such as paid time off, gift cards, or any other type of rewards.

The opinion does not discuss requiring the non-attorney staff working the booth to identify themselves as paralegals. Anyone approaching the booth to get more information would assume those staffing the booth are attorneys. As with all interactions, paralegals must confirm that others, particularly members of the public, understand they are not attorneys.

It was not that long ago when attorney advertisements, including a booth at a public event, would have been frowned upon by most attorneys. However, many members of the public are still not aware of their rights and how an attorney and the legal system may assist them. For those people, a booth at a public event may be one of the ways to provide that information. They may then consider discussing their situation with an attorney to determine their legal rights and options.


Ultimately, the Professional Ethics Committee of the State Bar of Texas concluded that since the public could bypass the booth without engaging with the staff and was under no obligation to interact with the staff or take a brochure, and as long as the attorney took steps to ensure the staff was not providing legal advice, the activity is permitted.


### **READER'S CORNER**

#### **Marty Olson:**









Had to read a light book after reading the book above:


The Right Time by Danielle Steel. This book is about a female's life who grows up to write crime books using a male pen name because her father told her females could not write crime books.


